Get Your District Club Day Entries Ready!

Now is the time to be planning what you will be doing for District 4-H Club Day! What about a demonstration or project talk, gavel games, a dance, a reading or skit, playing an instrument or singing, just to name a few entry options?

District 4-H Club Day will be held on **Saturday, February 22, 2020** at Republic County High School in Belleville. Judging contests will be available for 4-Hers to participate in, which may qualify them to compete at the State contests! There are **rule changes for Dance** this year, so be sure to read the rules carefully for those entries.

Entry forms and rule books have been given to Club Leaders. The District 4-H Club Day rule book is also posted on the River Valley District web page and can be found under 4-H Youth Development, Forms & Resources, Club Day. You may also stop by any River Valley District Extension Office to receive a hard copy of the rule book. Additional information and tips on presentations can also be found on the Club Day webpage. Be sure that the rule book you are using has “Revised October 2019” in the lower right hand corner.

Entries for District 4-H Club Day are completed through your 4-H Club Leader, so sign up with them at your next club meeting! Club leaders must have completed registration forms turned in to their local River Valley District Extension Office by Tuesday, January 14, 2020.

Northeast Leadership Event (NELE) to be held at Rock Springs

The Northeast Area 4-H Leadership event, (NELE), will be held on Saturday January 18, 2020 at the Rock Springs 4-H Center from 9:30am to 4:30pm. All youth 4-H age 12 to 18 and adult volunteers are invited to attend. This is considered a state 4-H event. This year’s theme is “*Jammin’ Out with Leadership*”.

Delegates will enjoy meeting within focus groups and hearing from a guest speaker. Youth will register for multiple sessions to attend during NELE. Adult volunteers will also have sessions available.

Don’t miss this opportunity to meet new people, learn new leadership skills, and enjoy fun classes!

Registration is \$30 and includes lunch, snack and t-shirt. Registration will open in November.

4-H Volunteers

Beginning in the 2019-2020 4-H program year, the 4-H Volunteer process has been changed and streamlined. When you, as an adult 4-H Volunteer, enroll through 4HOnline, the process will take now the place of what was prior the paper volunteer application. Once you enter your information in the system this year, you will simply have to reenroll each year. As you complete your 4HOnline profile, please remember to complete **all** sections including what project areas you are willing to volunteer with. If you are a returning 4-H Volunteer and have completed a criminal background check (CBC) within the last 3 year, this may be all you have to do! Your local 4-H Program Manager will contact you if additional information is needed.

If you are a **first year** 4-H Volunteer, your local 4-H Program Manager will be contacting you regarding completing a CBC and additional training that may need to be completed.

Thank you to all of the current River Valley District 4-H Volunteers! The impact that a 4-H volunteer has is truly priceless. While the RVD has been fortunate to have wonderful 4-H volunteers, there is a constant need for more adults to volunteer with our 4-H youth!

Take a moment to think about what skills and passion that you possess that you could share with 4-H youth. Maybe you have a neighbor, family member, teacher, etc., that would be a great volunteer with 4-H. Help us recruit them to assist with our youth development program! You can share with them the enrollment guide for volunteers listed above or they can contact Jordan Schuette, the 4-H agent, at 785-527-5084 to discuss volunteer options.

State 4-H Scholarships

Each year, Kansas 4-H Foundation and its donors give numerous scholarships to excelling 4-H members. All current 4-H members who are seniors and will be attending college and those past 4-H members who are attending college are encouraged to complete the scholarship application.

We are waiting on State 4-H to release the 2020 version of the scholarship. Once it is available, we will post it on our River Valley District 4-H website at www.rivervalley.k-state.edu/4-h/scholarship.html or it may be picked up at your local River Valley District Extension Office.

In the past, these have been the 8 steps to complete the Kansas 4-H Scholarship application. We do not foresee any changes but will update our eligible members once the applications are released.

Please follow the steps carefully and assemble it in the correct order. You will need the following:

1. Completed Kansas 4-H Scholarship application.
2. Transcript.
3. Letter of Recommendation – high school or college personnel.

4. Letter of Recommendation – 4-H leader or Extension staff.
5. One page list of 4-H leadership, community service, participation, and recognition.
6. One page essay on how “4-H has impacted me.”
7. One page list of non-4-H leadership, community service, participation, and recognition in school and community.
8. Short paragraph about educational and lone-term career goals.

Don't wait until the last minute. Ask for letters of recommendation as early as possible to be considerate of others and their busy schedules!

A lot of the information will be on your permanent record **IF** you kept it up to date correctly, including your participation, leadership, citizenship and recognition.

Good luck to all River Valley District 4-H members! Completed applications and all supporting materials are due back to your local River Valley District Extension Office by January 22, 2020 so we are able to deliver scholarship applications to K-State by the deadline.

Citizenship Washington Focus

Kansas 4-H will **not** be coordinating a state wide Citizenship Washington Focus (CWF) experience for youth during the summer of 2020. Due to challenges in reaching bus capacity in recent years, Kansas 4-H Youth Development has decided to pause their sponsorship and start a conversation on how CWF is being utilized within local 4-H units.

Regional 4-H Club Day

If you receive a Top Purple in an eligible division at District 4-H Day, you may compete at Regional 4-H Club Day. If you are eligible to complete, you will be contacted by your local RVED office following District 4-H Club Day.

Regional Club Day entries will be due to your local office by 4:30pm on March 9, 2020.



Scholarships to Attend 4-H Events and Camps Available

There are 4-H entities in the River Valley District that offer scholarships to 4-H members to attend 4-H events and camps! Make sure to also ask within your club as they possibly offer scholarships to their members too.

Here is a list of scholarship opportunities available by each county:

RVD-Clay Center

- 4-H Council—4-H members may apply for scholarships for the following events:
 - Kansas Youth Leadership Forum—5 youth—50% fee covered
 - Citizenship in Action—10 youth—50% fee covered
 - Discovery Days—10 youth—50% fee covered
- Development Fund— 4-H members may apply for 4-H Camps and College scholarships. A committee distributes scholarships based on funds available.

RVD-Concordia

- 4-H Council—Each 4-H member, after completing one year of 4-H enrollment, may apply for an annual \$50 scholarship to attend an event and/or camp, such as Citizenship in Action, Discovery Days, 4-H Camp, etc.
- Youth Fund—4-H members, after completing one year of 4-H enrollment, may apply for scholarships for 4-H events and activities. An executive board distributes scholarships based on funds available.

RVD-Belleville

- 4-H Council—Each 4-H member may apply for an annual \$100 scholarship to attend an event and/ or camp, such as Citizenship in Action, Discovery Days, 4-H Camp, etc. Each 4-H member may apply for an additional \$10 scholarship to attend the Northeast Leadership Event (NELE) which is considered a state event.

RVD-Washington

- 4-H Council—Each 4-H member may apply for an annual \$100 scholarship to attend an event and/ or camp, such as Citizenship in Action, Discovery Days, 4-H Camp, etc. Each 4-H member may apply for an additional \$15 scholarship to attend the Northeast Leadership Event (NELE).
- 4-H Booster Club—Each 4-H member may apply for an annual \$50 scholarship to attend an event and/ or camp, such as Citizenship in Action, Discovery Days, 4-H Camp, etc.

If you have any questions regarding a scholarship to attend an event or camp, please contact the 4-H Program Manager in your local River Valley District Extension Office to find out how to apply!

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals—YQCA

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals, YQCA, is the livestock quality assurance program that is required to sell livestock in the premium auction or to participate in the Kansas State Fair Grand Drive or Kansas Jr. Livestock Show.

YQCA is offered through an online training for \$12/child or in-person training for \$3/person. Be looking for an e-mail with more information regarding the YQCA program, including new details!

Livestock Premium Sale/Project Auction Requirements

Planning ahead is an important life skill to learn so start today!

If you are planning on participating in the livestock premium sale at the Clay County, Cloud County, Washington County, or NCK Free Fair, or the project auction at the Clay County Fair, youth must meet certain requirements to be eligible to participate! Look ahead now at what your choices are so you don't end up ineligible!

Check out the form for more information but here is the basic list of requirements!

- Attend 3 (three) Club Meetings
- YQCA (for Livestock Premium Sales only)
- Attend 3 (three) of the Approved 4-H Activities

Shooting Sports

River Valley District 4-H offers five Shooting Sports disciplines – **BB Gun, Air Rifle, Archery, Small Bore Rifle (22), and Shot Gun.** We host all of the Shooting Sports Safety Meetings, Practice Shoots, and Fair Shoots at the Cloud County Fairgrounds (East of Concordia – Just south of the intersection of Industrial Road and Kansas Highway 9).

Eligibility & Requirements

Per National and State 4-H bylaws, enrolled 4-H members between the 4-H ages of 8 to 18 (before January 1st, 2020) are eligible to participate in Shooting Sports. Kansas 4-H competitive age is 9 (before January 1, 2020), a state event or state qualifying match. Youth must be enrolled in the project on 4-HOnline and attend a safety meeting. Our Shooting Sports instructors may determine if youth are developmentally able to participate in each discipline. A parent/guardian **MUST** accompany youth to each discipline at each shoot.

Safety Meetings

Our coordinator and instructors host two safety meetings each year. All participating 4-H'ers **MUST** attend one of these two safety meetings before they can participate in Shooting Sports. A parent/guardian **MUST** accompany youth to the Safety Meeting. Completing paperwork for Shooting Sports will occur after the safety meeting and all youth may shoot following the completion of their paperwork and payment received.

Registration & Sign-In

Each day Shooting Sports events are held, youth **MUST check-in** with our volunteers at the Commercial Building before going to any discipline. When you check in, you will receive a name tag. You must have this name tag on before any instructor will allow you to participate. Once you have completed your disciplines for the day, you **MUST** check out at the Commercial Building. **Failing to check in and/or out will result in no credit for that shoot.**

At each discipline, instructors will have a sign-in sheet. After practicing that discipline, instructors will have youth sign-in acknowledging participation. **Failing to sign in at each discipline will result in no credit for that shoot.**

To help alleviate the waiting times at the disciplines, we have implemented a time schedule. These times are for Practice and Fair Shoot dates only. Safety Meetings will begin promptly at 1:00 p.m. with shooting following immediately for all youth. The **last time for check-in will be 2:30 p.m.** Youth will **NOT** be allowed to participate if they check in after this time.

RVD – Clay Center & RVD – Concordia 1:00 p.m.

RVD – Belleville & RVD – Washington 2:00 p.m.

Fair Shoot

To participate in the Fair Shoot, each 4-H'er must complete **four** regular practice shoots in each discipline prior to the Fair Shoot. If this requirement is not met, youth may still participate in the Fair Shoot, but will be dropped one ribbon place per discipline in which the four practice shoot requirement is not met.

Once they have completed their requirements, youth may designate either of the following two dates as their Fair Shoot. However, once youth have designated a Fair Shoot day, they will not be able to change that date. Youth are **not** able to complete a practice shoot and the Fair Shoot on the same day.

County Champions

Results from the Fair Shoot will be displayed at your local county fair. In order to be eligible to be a county champion, 4-H'ers must participate in the following throughout the year and at the Fair Shoot:

Seniors (14-18 4-H age) must do four out of five disciplines

Juniors (8-13 4-H age) must do three out of five disciplines

If a 4-H'er chooses to do all disciplines at the Fair Shoot, only their top scores will be used. The lowest discipline score(s) will be dropped. (Example: A 10 year-old 4-H'er competes in all five disciplines. She does best at Archery, Shot Gun, and BB Gun. These three scores are used to calculate her overall score. Her two lowest scores are not used to calculate her overall score for County Champion consideration).

Weather

If we have to cancel a shoot due to weather, we will put an announcement on area radio stations, send an e-mail to all 4-H families with youth enrolled in Shooting Sports, and post it on the River Valley 4-H Facebook page. If you hear of a cancellation, please help us by contacting fellow 4-H members with the news!

Fees

Shooting Sports fees help cover the expenses of materials, instructor training, etc. The total cost due per 4-H member will depend on which disciplines the 4-H'er is participating in. If they want to participate in all disciplines, the total cost due is \$45. All fees **MUST** be paid prior to youth participating in their first shoot.

\$10 for combination of Archery, BB, and Air Rifle

\$25 for Shotgun

\$10 for Small Bore Rifle

Shooting Sports - Trap Team

In addition to the general 4-H Shooting Sports disciplines, River Valley District 4-H offers a Trap Team. Trap Team shoots 50 clays from 5 trap pads 16 yards behind the thrower. The Trap Team Shoots are held at the Cloud County Fairgrounds (East of Concordia – Just south of the intersection of Industrial Road and Kansas Highway 9).

Eligibility & Requirements

Enrolled 4-H members between the 4-H ages of 8 – 18 (before January 1st, 2019) are eligible to participate in the Trap Team but must also be enrolled in Shooting Sports – Shot Gun on 4-HOnline and a paid and bona fide member of the Shooting Sports Shot Gun discipline. Our Shooting Sports instructors may determine if youth are developmentally able to participate on the Trap Team.

Shoots

Trap Team Shoots will be held after the completion of the regular Shooting Sports practice and fair shoots. Additional times may be scheduled at different times by the instructions. State Qualifying Matches will be held over the summer in varying locations with the State Trap Shoot being held in October 2019. Youth must be age 13-18 to participate in the State Trap Shoot competition.

Weather

If we have to cancel a shoot due to weather, we will put an announcement on area radio stations, send an e-mail to all 4-H families with youth enrolled in Shooting Sports, and post it on the River Valley 4-H Facebook page. If you hear of a cancellation, please help us by contacting fellow 4-H member with the news!

Fees & Equipment

In addition to being a paid member of the Shot Gun discipline, youth must pay \$15 to participate on the Trap Team and must provide their own shells for every shoot.
